

## LUNCHTIME LEISURE

After you've come down from your blissful cloud, give Nazelrod more of your money by traveling to her 4-year-old space, Spa on the Avenue (8165 Honeygo Blvd., Suite E, White Marsh; 410-931-1130; spaontheave.com). At 6,200 square feet, Avenue's half the size of Spa in the Valley, giving it a more intimate feel. Each treatment area has swoopy canopies over the beds, making the rooms restful and luxurious.

Once ensconced, get radiant with Eminence Sweet Red Rose Hydrating Facial (\$82, 60 minutes). Whole rose petals combine with lemon, honey and glycerine to smooth and heal dry or sensitive skin, making it nearly literally good enough to eat. Plus, Eminence products are handmade in Hungary using organically grown herbs, fruits and vegetables. In the freakishly neat backroom, Nazelrod pulled out examples of the line to smell: There were no chemical scents, no harsh alcohol stinging the nose. The rose-scented items smelled, in fact, just like roses.



**JOB? WHAT JOB?** At Spa in the Valley, stop in the Tuscan room before your treatment for a quick dip in the waterfall-bedecked whirlpool, or bliss out in the sauna. Usually, only women are allowed in the room, but on Mondays it's men-only.
